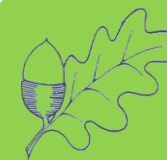

Maths

Covering the range of the maths curriculum from number to shape, relating elements of maths to explore different areas, such as:
Statistics – collecting data; rainfall, wind speed, noise level, etc.
Linking to map with measures, as well as drawing to scales and for year 6 identifying ratios.

Geography

Study local wildlife and geographic features of Melton, including Melton woods. Create sketch maps using the Wilderness War text and link it to the local area. Collect and accurately measure information (e.g. rainfall, temperature, wind, noise levels etc.)

Computing

Year 5 and 6 will be designing and creating a game project. This will involve designing algorithms that use repetition and two-way selection, as well as

Science

Classification – Explain the process of classification, based on the observations of scientist Linnaeus, including micro-organisms, plants and animals.

Evolution and inheritance – Using the observational studies of Darwin to recognise that living things change over time. Recognising that offspring are similar, but not identical, to their parents.

Design Technology

Design and create a bug hotel/ animal shelter using a range of materials and tools.
