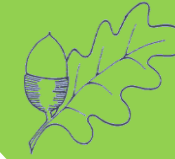

Maths

This term, Eagles will be continuing their place value knowledge in daily maths lessons. We will also be looking at fractions, shape and measure. This will include calculating a fraction of an amount using resources such as multilink, naming and grouping 2D and 3D shapes, and comparing different forms of measure including ml, kg and cm.

Geography

Eagles will be learning all about the Tropical Rainforests. We will investigate where we can find them, what the different layers of the rainforest are, and what different species survive in these habitats.

Computers

We will be using our computer skills to create our own documentaries, as well as looking at E-safety.

English

In English, we will be using our key text 'Journey to the River Sea' to:

- Write some letters as Maia from 'Journey to the River Sea'.
- Write and perform poems.
- Create a rainforest debate!

This term, Eagles will be looking at Hindus. We will investigate why Hindu's want good karma, talk about some Hindu stories and also look at what snakes and ladders was used for.

History

In History, Eagles will be looking at the Mayans. We will explore how they settled, which links closely to our wet and wild topic. Children will also learn key concepts within History which they can link to other topics, including achievements of the Mayan civilisation and how it impacts us today.

Music

We will be investigating how to create repeated patterns with different instruments, and creating accompaniments for tunes.

Art

We will be creating our own rainforest animals using a variety of materials including oil pastel, chalk and fabric!

Design Technology

Eagles will be growing their own seeds to investigate what a plant needs to survive! Following this, we will be designing, creating and evaluating our own mini-greenhouses.

Science

In science, Eagles will be looking at plants and living things. We will cover topics such as:

- Identifying and labelling the different parts of a plant and their functions.
- Exploring how water is transported through a plant.
- Identifying how living things can be classified in different ways.
