Phonics - Suffixes (20 mins)	Children to read out sounds on the complex speed sound chart daily (http://www.thorngroveprimary.co.uk/wp-content/uploads/2019/01/Complex-speed-sounds-chart.pdf). Sound out and blend words for the daily sound/pattern (see below). Write these words down. **Challenge yourself; Can you think of any words on your own for the daily pattern? Write these words into sentences; try to use different openers, subordination (when, if, that, because) and coordination (and, or, but). Handwriting	Practise reading and writing the Year 2 common exception words (https://monsterphonics.com/wp-content/uploads/2018/05/Common-Exception-Word-Flashcards-Colour-Coded-1-unprotected..pdf) and high frequency words (http://www.highfrequencywords.org/next-200-high-frequency-word-list-cursive.html) or choose 2 letters (https://www.teachhandwriting.co.uk/continuous-cursive-beginners-choice-4.html) a day! Don't forget to use those horizontal and diagonal strokes - joined letters!				
English	<p>Read 'Sunflower Plant Life Cycle'</p> <p>Answer the comprehension questions as follows:</p> <p>1. How many different types of sunflower are there? 2. What colours can sunflowers be? 3. How tall was the tallest sunflower ever grown? 4. Why is the sunflower seed planted in spring? 5. What colour are the seeds? 6. What grows above ground and underground during the second stage? 7. When does the bud form? 8. What happens when the flower shrivels? 9. How many new seeds can fall from the head of the shrivelled flower?</p> <p>Try this independently first, then edit your answers with a different colour if needed. Write in full sentences.</p> <p>Answers can be found after the text.</p> <p>***Challenge yourself by writing your own questions about the text, send them to Miss Jones!</p>	<p>Watch 'Sunflower House' by Eve Bunting: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=f8NLRbZ4tBY</p> <p>Discuss these questions: Who are the characters? What happens at the beginning? Middle? End?</p> <p>Can you try one (or more!) of these writing challenges:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Can you write and summarise the story in only 6 bullet points? Can you set the timer for 10 minutes and see how much of the story you can write down? Can you write your own short story about Sunflowers? 	<p>Grow your own sunflower: If not watch how to do it here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7c_JSqu40A</p> <p>Can you write a set of instructions about how to look after a plant?</p> <p>Don't forget to include: a title, numbers or bullet points, adjectives, subordination (when, if, that, because) and coordination (and, or, but), time connectives, full stops, bossy verbs, capital letters, clear handwriting!</p> <p>An example of your first instruction could be: <i>First put the soil in the pot.</i></p> <p>Could you write a sunflower diary about your plant? You could also draw or print your picture off.</p> <p>Once you've written your 4 sentences, think about another flower or plant - you can be really imaginative and make one up!</p> <p>Try to write six sentences to describe what it looks like.
