The Romans lived in Rome, a city in the centre of the country of Italy.



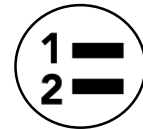
The Romans invaded and conquered many countries in Europe before heading to Britain.



The Romans introduced roads, public baths, amphitheatres and temples, which can be seen around Britain today.



Julius Caesar was the first emperor who tried to invade Britain by using a powerful army.



Roman Numerals are a number system developed in ancient Rome where letters represent numbers.



Boudicca was a Celtic Queen who led the revolt against the Romans.

753BC – Rome was founded by Romulus.

55BC – Julius Caesar's first attempt to invade Britain which was unsuccessful.

54BC – Julius Caesar's second attempt to invade Britain which was successful.

43AD – Claudius expanded the Roman empire with a successful invasion.

60AD – Queen Boudicca rebelled against the Romans.

122AD – Hadrian's wall is built to protect the Romans' land.

312AD – Christianity becomes the official religion of the Roman empire.

410AD – Last Romans leave Britain.
